Live and Learn

This new 'Live and Learn!' feature will become a staple of monthly Strike Team newsletters. Our goal is to spread newly obtained knowledge provided from Strike Team partners.



Last year, FoHVOS conducted two restoration projects that were hampered by two of our annual invasive species friends...Mile-a-Minute and Japanese Stiltgrass. Both projects included postash death explosions of woody invasive species such as Muliflora Rose and started with forestry mowing to clear the slate for planting native trees, shrubs and wildflowers.

We happily and diligently planted thousands of plants last spring, only to find Mile-a-Minute and Japanese Stiltgrass running amok through summer. Mechanical treatments were attempted to minimize damage (weed whacking), but the smothering plants were vicious!

We feel that most of our plantings likely survived, but we needed to get a better strategy going for 2020. So we decided on pre-emergent herbicide (e.g., Preen or similar) that we'll apply around plantings in late February, late April and late June. This will significantly

minimize these annual weeds, allowing our plantings to get fully established. We plan to repeat this effort for a few years to let the seed banks dwindle.
