Live and Learn

With the help of our exceptional Technical Advisory Committee, we completed our annual species review and prepared our <u>2020 species list</u> as well as our updated <u>Do Not Plant List</u>. In addition, please consider signing our <u>Landscape Planting Pledge</u>.

Turning Your Eyes Up

Many plants have their moment of pushing exuberant growth. If you have a flower garden (hopefully stocked with many natives), you'll notice plants when they're blooming. Take the native wildflower, Wild Bergamot (Monarda fistulosa), which was the star of many native gardens in July. Now heading to seed, the plant fades into the background while Goldenrods take center stage.

Invasive species do much the same. Now is a great time to look for invasive grasses. Many are beginning to bolt (grow exponentially taller, flower, and set seed). Chinese Silvergrass (Miscanthus sinensis) is a great example. Surveying for non-flowering grasses is tricky amongst thick meadow growth. They are difficult to identify and can go overlooked. Now, Chinese Silvergrass' recognizable flowering stems are beginning to stand out and can be observed from great distances.

Tune your eyes and survey at the right time!
