



Aquatic Invasive Species Management Plan

- Coordinate statewide AIS management efforts, priorities, and needs
- Guide monitoring and response efforts statewide
- Evaluate opportunities for AIS prevention
- Establish & maintain funding sources for spread prevention, control, eradication
- An approved plan allows for states to apply for federal funding for implementation





- Prevention and educational opportunities








Monitoring, Detection, & Response
